Counselor's Connection

Meadowlark has incorporated the topic of bulling prevention in lessons and activities. Examples of activities to teach about bullying include presentations, such as:

- Speech or role-play on stopping bullying
- Discussions about topics like reporting bullying
- Creative writing, such as a poem speaking out against bullying or a story teaching bystanders how to help
- Artistic work, such as a collage about respect or the effects of bullying
- Classroom meetings to talk about peer relations

If you see bullying or are being bullied, please let a teacher, counselor or other trusted adult know as soon as possible. Bullying will not be tolerated. Stand up for your rights!
